

Parent association summary of roles & responsibilities

Chairperson: Ruhie Fyjun Ali

The Chair provides leadership for the committee sets the agenda for meetings and manages meetings in line with the agenda. A key role for all committee members is to manage and control the funds raised. Although all the committee members have equal responsibility for the control and management of funds, the Treasurer plays an important part in helping the committee carry out these duties properly by maintaining up-to-date records of all financial transactions.

A vital role within the association is promoting and communicating the work. The publicity officer must be an excellent communicator both in writing and in person, publicising events and fundraising initiatives.
