Y1 Home Learning

Hello 1 Elm and 1 Beech. We are missing you all but hope to see most of you in the Google Classroom or back in school as soon as we are all able to return.

While you are not coming into school it is really important you continue to practise the skills we have been learning in class and do your home learning with a grown up or sometimes by yourself at home.

Google Classroom

We have set up two classrooms which we would like everyone in 1 Elm & 1 Beech to join.

Any work we set for you, or other suggestions for activities, will be posted in our Google Classrooms, so please login every day to see the work we have posted for you. These are the codes you need to access our Google Classrooms:

1 Elm - iu2kjl3

1 Beech - i3jadxg

Your passwords are stuck into the front of your homework books.

Each day your teachers will set you a Maths, English and a Topic lesson which will cover either science, geography, history or art and design Technology. You will also have weekly spelling, handwriting, P.E. and music activities to complete too.

Your remote learning on Google Classroom will be in different formats as follows:

- Some live streamed sessions with your teacher and your classmates
- Some videos which will help you with your learning, for example: demonstration activities, some modelled examples of how to apply your learning, reading stories
- PowerPoint slides which provide you with instructions and guidance on how to do activities
- Work activities for you to complete independently
- Links to other online learning resources
- The Stream where you can ask questions and have discussion with your teacher about your learning. The teacher may will provide you with feedback here too.

Search for Google Classrooms click on the + sign and 'Join class' then enter the code. To access your account, you will need to use your login and password (see the instructions at the end of this document if you are having trouble logging in).

Reading and Phonics

Please try to read every day with an adult and talk about what you have read together. Use any books you have at home and the websites below.

Your teachers will set new books for you on **Oxford Reading Buddy** each week. <u>Writing</u>

There are many ways you could continue to practise your writing.

- A daily diary of what you are doing and how you are feeling
- Letters to friends, family members, teachers or imaginary characters
- Write some sentences about a film you watched or a game you played
- Write stories
- Retell a story that we have read in class e.g. Funny Bones, The Hungry Caterpillar or Grizzly Dad

When you write, remember to sound out the words using your Fred Fingers. Don't forget to use capital letters, finger spaces and a full stop.

Maths

Remember to practise your number bonds to 10 at home. You could sing the number bonds to 10 rhyme we have learned or play number bonds to 10 ping pong (An adult says a number from 0-10 and you answer with the matching number bond to 10 e.g. If your adult says 6 you would answer with 4 because 6+4=10).






