Google Classroom

Hello Year 2. Whilst we are away from school, it is very important for you to continue your learning at home. You will need to login to your Google Classroom every day and try to do **all** the learning tasks we have assigned for you.

Your remote learning on Google Classroom will be in different formats as follows:

- Some live streamed sessions with your teacher and your classmates
- Some videos which will help you with your learning, for example: demonstration activities, some modelled examples of how to apply your learning, reading stories
- PowerPoint slides which provide you with instructions and guidance on how to do activities
- Work activities for you to complete independently
- Links to other online learning resources
- The Stream where you can ask questions and have discussion with your teacher about your learning. The teacher may will provide you with feedback here too.

Any work we set for you, or other suggestions for activities, will be posted in our Google Classrooms, so please make sure you login! These are the codes you need to access our Google Classrooms:

To access your account, you will need to use your login and password. These can be found in the inside cover of both of your homework books and your reading record journal.

Each day your teachers will set you a Maths, English and a Topic lesson which will cover either science, geography, history, art or design technology. You will also have weekly spelling, handwriting, P.E. and music activities to complete too.

Each day's learning will be explained to you by your teacher in Google Classroom and we would like you to try and do all the work and activities we set for you.

Reading

You must continue to read every day for a minimum of 10 minutes. Use your current reading book and any books you have at home. You can also read websites, newspapers, magazines and comics.

Your teachers will set new books for you on Oxford Reading Buddy each week. Follow the link below and use the logins you have been given to access your account. **Don't forget our school code is:** mcbxn. https://www.oxfordreadingbuddy.com/uk

Spelling

Your teacher will be setting you weekly spellings on Google Classroom for you to learn. You should also practise the spelling words you have learnt throughout the year. These can be found in your homework books.

Writing

Your teacher will be setting you daily writing lessons on Google Classroom for you to complete. There are also many extra ways you could continue to practise your writing.
