Year 4 children have been comparing numbers by making mathematical statements. They used the symbols for greater than, less than and equal to. Making general statements about numbers helps the children to compare properties and increase their confidence when talking about number. They enjoyed using the hungry crocodile, too!



Year 5: Climate Change Ambassadors

Year 5 took part in the annual science challenge, which is run by The Francis Crick Institute in conjunction with Regent High School. This year's theme was entitled, "The Climate Change Emergency: The World Is Not Listening." The task was to collect and analyse data, then present their findings in a creative way.



The children carried out research on how much recycling is happening in their homes. They collected data and found an average number of items that were recycled by a Year 5 student.

They rehearsed and presented a video to explain their findings.






They also produced some excellent persuasive writing in the form of information posters to encourage us all to Reduce, Re-use and Recycle.

A New Game for Online Safety


Cyber Aware is the government's website for advice on cyber safety. They have introduced a new game called Cyber Sprinters. This is a new interactive game from the National Cyber Se-
